National College Fair October 21 & October 22, 2016

This fair allows students to interact with admissions representatives from a nationwide collection of colleges and universities. They will have an opportunity to discuss degree programs, financial aid, the admission process, campus life and information pertinent to the selection process. The fair also sponsors separate workshops covering such topics as the NCAA, financial aid, and college admission trends. This fair is held at the Washington State Convention and Trade Center, Seattle: Friday, October 21 hours are 9 AM - Noon and Saturday, October 22 hours from Noon - 4PM. Washington State Healthy Youth Survey 2016

Students at Cedarcrest High School will be taking the Healthy Youth Survey on Thursday, October 20th during an extended advisory.

The Healthy Youth Survey includes questions related to physical activity and diet, unintentional and intentional injury, substance abuse, risk and protective factors, and access to school-based services. Survey results are used by schools, communities and state agencies to plan programs to support our youth and reduce their risks. The Healthy Youth Survey is given to students in grades 6, 8, 10 and 12 across Washington State. Participation in the survey is voluntary and the students' answers are anonymous.

Release of Student Directory Information to the Military

Under Federal Law, all high schools are required to release student directory information (name, address, and phone number) of all 11th and 12th graders to the military branches. However, under the Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965, and as amended by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, you have the right to request that your student information be withheld. If you are currently a junior or senior, or the parent of a junior or senior, and wish to have the information withheld, please contact Debra Frost at 425-844-4808 or email at frostd@riverview.wednet.edu no later than December 1, 2016. Seniors, if you requested removal last year you do not have to request again.

Homecoming Dance

School Dance Information

The Dance: Homecoming is our largest dance of the year where we typically host

over 500 students! Because of the size of this dance, as well as a desire of the students to go out of the valley for dining, this dance is held off campus.

When: This year the homecoming dance will be held on Saturday October 8th at the Future of Flight. The dance starts at 8:00PM and is over at 11:00PM.

Where: The Future of Flight is located at 8415 Paine Field Blvd., Mukilteo, WA. Students need to provide their own transportation to and from the dance.

Who: This dance is open to all Cedarcrest students in grades 9 through 12.

Guests: Students are allowed to bring a guest from another school as long as the guest is high school aged or under the age of 21 and a guest pass is completed and turned into the main office by Wednesday, October 5th. NO EXCEPTIONS!

What to Wear: Homecoming is a semi-formal dance. Male students are expected to dress in sport coats, suits or tuxedos. Female students are expected to dress in an evening dress or gown. All students and their guests must be dressed appropriately or they will be denied entrance.

Cost: \$30 (with ASB) to \$40 per person (guests and students without ASB). Students with ASB cards are given a \$10 discount.

School Dance Policy

Dances will be chaperoned by parents of CHS students and Riverview School District staff members only. Students who wish to bring a guest from another school must obtain a "Dance Guest Request Form" from the office. This form must be completed and turned in to the office by 3:00 p.m. Wednesday, October 5th.

School rules regarding student behavior, use of tobacco, alcohol and illegal drugs will be upheld at dances. Sexually suggestive dances, gestures and physical contact are prohibited.

The following guidelines will be enforced:

- All dancers need to face their partner.
- Keep both feet near the floor. No sitting or lying down on the dance floor.
- No bumping or grinding with your partner.
- Hand placement on your partner must be appropriate for a school setting.
- There must be space between partners.
- No freak dancing or "moshing" on the dance floor.
- Any other behaviors deemed to be inappropriate by the chaperones will be stopped.

Students who engage in such behavior will be asked to leave the dance. Any student who is asked to leave the dance will not be entitled to a refund. The administration has the right and responsibility to deny entrance at the door and any students choosing to ignore any rules shall be asked to leave the dance. Students who are truant from school on the Friday before a dance or are under an out of school suspension on the Friday before a dance are not allowed to attend an event the following Saturday and will not receive a refund.


