Message from the Principal...

One of the tools I talk to our staff about all year long is the power of reflection on their teaching. I believe that reflecting on our work and our life can help us improve in ways we can't even imagine. As we head into summer I invite our school community; students, parents, and staff, to reflect on the 2016-17 school year. For all of us there have been successes and challenges. The article stated that in 2001, "about 5 percent of students reported being bullied."

Jump forward to 2008 and that statistic rose to 31 percent of students reported being bullied. Take another leap and most recently this statistic is over 50 percent at some schools! Why? Are we really becoming such a nasty society? The factual difference is, the most recent statistic includes "cyber bullying," an issue that we really didn't even have to address 10 to 15 years ago. Social media has added a new *playground* for students to bully each other, one that can allow them to remain anonymous for the most part while they hurt others. This is an unacceptable practice and we need, as a society, to get a handle on it. Granted, not something our CHS community is going to solve for society, but we can do *our* part to impact *our* school community. We can continue to talk to our children and students about the appropriate and responsible use of technology.

I know we are going to continue to do our part as a school, and I will be spending time "*reflaxing*" this summer to come up with ideas on how we can continue to help end the irresponsible use of social media. But in all honesty, although we *think* we have influence on our students, who has the "*real*" influence? I will tell you who I think the influential people are in our students' lives, the people who provide role modeling all year long, and that is family. Family has influence over our youth because not only are you paying for the cellular phones, cars, food, and clothing of these students, you are also the people they look to as role models. Let's not underestimate the power we have as parents, guardians, brothers, sisters, and grandparents (to name a few), to influence our children. And a special message to our students, *don't ever forget the positive influence you can have on your friends. The power to promote positive use of social media as responsible young adults.* Let's set a goal to reflect with our children on how they use devices, learn from our past and let's use what we discover to prepare for an even better 2017-18 school year.

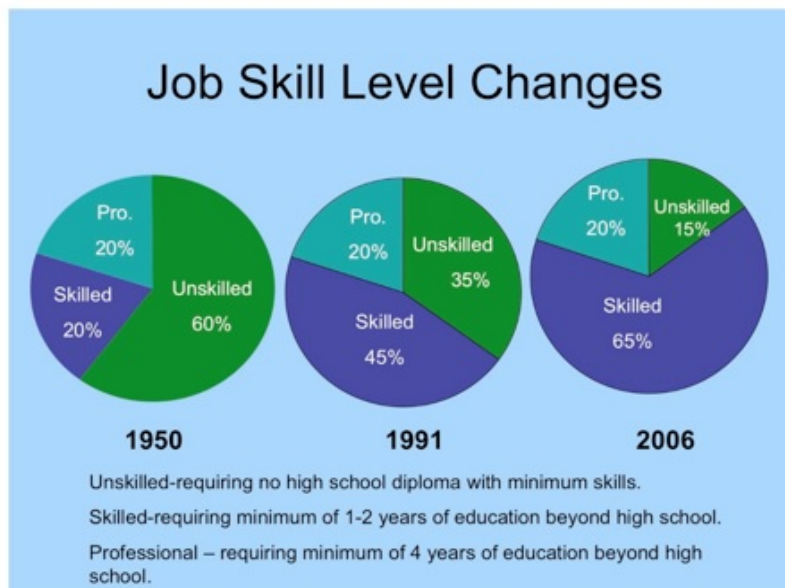

Student Health Plans

Students with Life-threatening conditions (severe allergies and asthma, diabetes, seizures, and some cardiac conditions) are mandated by Washington State Law to have medication and/or treatment orders and an Emergency Care Plan in place, prior to the first day of school. Children grow and treatments change and as a result we must create a new Care Plan for your student each school year. If your student had an Individual Health/Care plan in place this school year, you will receive a copy in the mail during the summer. Please review the plan with your student's health care provider, make updates as needed and either mail it to Cedarcrest High School ATTN: Nurse or bring it to Registration in August with your student's medication (if needed) and signed medication paperwork.

Medications at School

Students who must take prescription or have rescue medication at school because of a life-threatening condition are required to have an updated Medication Authorization form (available at school or on the RSD website) with written instructions and signature from their Licensed Health Care provider on file at school each year. Please arrange to have this form filled out prior to the beginning of the next school year.

**If your student had medication stored in the health room this year, an email will be sent in June with instructions on how to pick them up.

Vaccinations

A letter will be sent home this summer if your student needs vaccinations for the next school year. Please arrange with your health care provider to get these vaccinations this summer. A second Varicella vaccine is required for all high school students or a signed waiver on file. See WAC 392-380.
